

Minutes for March 6, 2023 Work Session, gaveled into session at 8:30 a.m. The meeting was called to order by Mayor Garry who led in the pledge to the Flag.

Laura Magone stated that the pony league has approached the Historical Society as the Harry Sickles Field is in need of repairs and they need to raise funds for a baseball mix that goes on the infield which will cost between \$4,000.00 and \$6,000.00 and will need labor and equipment to spread around the infield. They would like to know if there was anything the City could do either to help with the dirt or the equipment and individuals to help.

Councilman Kulak stated that they will think about it and maybe the Street Department has equipment that they could possibly use. He stated he received a call from Andrew Dunlevy for possible lighting for the field. The City would have to look into the zoning and regulations and see what the requirements are and if it would be possible.

Susan, Peggy, and myself are the gardeners for the gazebo and are here and want to give input for the renovations. They were looking at different colors of stone that would match the roof and thinking capping the planters.



Terry Necciai, 400 Meade Street representing the Main Street Program stated that they did a ceremony recently for the 100th anniversary and is looking for the original plans for the park. The Active Transportation Grant committee had a meeting the other day and had several organizations participated. He will be resubmitting the Dinning Platform Grant.

Frank Novotny the City Engineer stated that he has contacted PenDot regarding the Route 88 storm water pipe, he will be meeting with Chris on some MS-4 items, and he is waiting to get information back from the Corps regarding the Aquatorium.


Chris Spahr stated that the new lights have been installed between Second and Third Streets. The water company is digging up at the Mounds and will be there approximately two months.

Mayor Garry stated that since there was no further business to discuss that the work session is closed.
